- 5. Gardens will be judged mid-May.
- 6. Winner will be announced at the June 14, 2012 Rock Spring Garden Club meeting.All applicants are invited to attend this meeting.
- 7. Previous winners may participate again after three years.
- 8. Professionally designed gardens are not eligible.
- 9. Garden may be included on June tour.
