# Spotlight on Our Featured Speaker: Heather Shank-Givens

(Jane Razeghi, DIII Assistant Director)



We are excited to announce September's District III (DII) dynamic speaker - **Heather Shank-Givens** who is a **state & federal licensed wildlife rehabilitator and educator** since about 2017, as well as a board member with the Blue Ridge Wildlife Center in Boyce, VA. She has served as a featured speaker about vultures at other garden clubs throughout the state and is a highly regarded and recommended speaker by those already in this field of rescue & rehab.

Heather says she has always appreciated the "less loved" animals of the world and loves to educate on their behalf. "My first vulture was identified as a potential ambassador in 2018. I took the opportunity to take on a wildlife ambassador and learned all I could about vultures. The more I learned, the more interested I became and wanted to work to educate people on how amazing and critical they are."

- Heather worked for a number of years for the US Environmental Protection Agency.
- Worked 20+ years in the field of organ & tissue donation. Biology is her background.
- Currently works for "We Are Sharing Home," SC, an organ procurement organization as their Instructional Designer.
- Served as an *International Volunteer* in South Africa working with VulPro, a rehab, rescue, & breeding facility for the endangered Cape Vulture and African White Backed Vulture.

According to Heather, "Vultures are a critical component of the ecosystem yet are frequently misunderstood & maligned." Heather will provide facts and information you need to become informed and an enthusiastic advocate for these amazing species.

In addition to vultures past & present, she has 2 cats, 3 ducks, 2 chickens, and 1 hermit crab (>20 years old), 1 woodland box turtle (also a wildlife ambassador), one eastern king snake, bees, and worms (vermicomposting)!

Don't miss this fascinating program with Heather and her new vulture who is learning the ropes!

Monica Anschel is the National Capital Area Garden Clubs, Inc. (NCAAGC, our state unit) 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President and also in charge of all the NCAGC Awards. She strongly urges our DIII garden clubs to begin preparing application forms to submit your newsletter, yearbooks, perennial bloom (candidate) to both Nancy Moats and Jane Razeghi who are your District III (DIII) Co-Awards Chairs. Recently, Monica has held monthly Zoom meetings & distributed very helpful information regarding the NCAGC & other awards. She stresses that all the awards listed below must be sent to District III Co-Chairs first. As co-chairs, we make sure all applications are in order & convene our DIII Awards Committee who determines which applications move on to compete at the state (NCAGC) level. Remember that All Perennial Bloom Awards applicants are celebrated and recognized at our DIII March 2026 general meeting. So, if you submit a Bloom Application, that person will be recognized and honored.

For all of the following club submissions, criteria are identified at the NCAGC website (ncagardenclubs.org), under the "Awards" section. An **official application form** (required for each award application) is also found at the same website location & is required for each submission.

Please note that **October 1**, 2025 is the deadline for the following club submissions:

#### Newsletter –

- o 1 submission (3 different newsletters for 2025) per club allowed review criteria at ncagardenclubs.org (how to set up an account is described in the **In the Know** NCAGC newsletter)
- o An *application/cover sheet form* is required available at ncagardenclubs.org (under "Awards")
- o Need to electronically include 3 different newsletters published since January 1, 2025

#### Yearbooks –

- o 1 submission per club allowed & an application cover sheet/form is required
- o Need to electronically include a copy of the yearbook

#### Perennial Bloom Nominations –

o 1 submission per club allowed for a member – please review the criteria on the NCAGC website.

**January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025** are the designated eligible dates for any products or events your club has held in the last 9 months.

Your club can complete an **application/cover sheet** found at the NCAGC website - ncagardenclubs.org. The applications are to be submitted electronically to your DIII Awards Co-Chairs (email addresses are below).

Step 1: Go to the NCAGC website by typing ncagardenclubs.org (it is all "green" colored).

Step 2: **Scroll down** to after the narrative intro & you will see various squares with little photos above. Click on the printed word that says "**Awards**."

Step 3. Once you open "Awards," you should see 4 squares as follows:

- **Award Information** is the 2025 <u>NCAGC Rules for Awards</u>, the description of each award, its requirements & due date. Use this to figure out for which awards you want to apply. Some actually have monetary rewards.
- Award Application is the required cover sheet
- Book of Evidence some awards require this info, so this info explains exactly what to include in the "evidence"
- **Perennial Bloom** Award, Oct 1<sup>st</sup> describes the criteria. Nancy & I will complete the CAR-SGC required cover sheet if selected to go forward to NCAGC. For submission to DIII (us), you just need the Award Application/Cover Sheet, found in the Award Application box described above.
- Award of Honor, Oct 1<sup>st</sup> describes the requirements for this award.
