VFGC Grant Applications Due September 15

Does your garden club have projects planned for 2025-26 but not enough funds? Consider applying for one of two VFGC grants by Sept. 15, 2025. All clubs are encouraged to apply for a one-year grant of up to \$1000. This can be for a new or ongoing project. A club can apply for more than one grant in the same fiscal year if it is a different project. If the project is ongoing, a club can apply more than one time for a grant for the project (different VFGC fiscal years.) First time applicants shall receive priority over clubs that have received previous grants. The two grants have different applications, chairs, and judging panels. Grants to Beautify and Restore: The purpose of this grant is to provide financial support for clubs to restore gardens that have been damaged by natural disasters within Virginia OR beautify areas within Virginia garden club communities. Youth Project Grants ('Keys to the Future'): The purpose of this grant is to provide financial support for club members to work with youth to help them realize the rewards and life lessons from gardens and habitats and to become good stewards of the earth. The scope of these programs may include benefits to the community, environmental awareness education, plant-to-food connections, outdoor classroom projects, horticulture education, and the social aspects of gardening. Priority will be given to projects that promote the Presidents' Projects (NGC, SAR, VFGC) and that could not be undertaken without some financial assistance.

Please submit only one application per club per year. The deadline for submission is February 15, 2026. Applications will be reviewed by the committee, and winners will be announced at the Spring District Meeting on March 16, 2026.

NGC Plant America Grants 2025-26

Through the Plant America Grant program, **up** to \$2,000.00 may be awarded to be used for direct expenses of projects. Projects submitted to receive a grant may be a joint venture with another organization/s. The scope includes:

- Beautification and/or restoration
- Community gardens
- School gardens/classrooms
- Landscaping for Habitat for Humanity Homes
- Landscaping of Blue Star Memorial Markers
- Implementation of environmental practices
- A horticulture or environmental educational event for the public

The "Keys to the Future" Youth Project Grants Program, with a simple application procedure, is sponsored by the Virginia Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. for new or existing youth-centered programs. All VFGC clubs are encouraged to apply for a one-year grant up to \$1,000 for the purpose of working with young people and helping them realize the rewards and life lessons from gardens and habitats for becoming good stewards of the earth. The scope of these programs may include benefits to the community, environmental awareness/education, plant-to-food connections, outdoor classroom projects, horticulture education, and the social aspects of gardening.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: SEPTEMBER 15 of each year

Must be submitted by a VFGC member garden club.

PURPOSE: The purpose of "Keys to the Future" Youth Project Grants is to provide financial support for <u>clubs working with youth</u> on a specific project.

PROGRAM CRITERIA:

In evaluating grant applications, priority will be given to programs that emphasize one or more of these elements:

- number of youth participating/reached.
- benefits to the community
- environmental awareness/education
- horticulture educational focus or curricular/program integration
- plant-to-food connections.
- social aspects of gardening i.e., leadership development, team building, community support, or servicelearning.
- club member support and participation.

FUNDING GUIDELINES Grants will <u>NOT</u> be provided for:

- projects in which the club does not participate in some aspect.
- salaries or benefits of school personnel
- field trips outside Virginia.
- political action programs
- Eagle Scout projects
- capital drives and building funds.
- scholarships
- endowments
- lawsuits and litigation
- overhead costs

 consumables, one-time use items or giveaways, such as T-shirts, tote bags, food, admission fees, or tuition

Note: The same project is not eligible for both Youth Project Grants and Beautify & Restore Grants in the same VFGC fiscal year.
