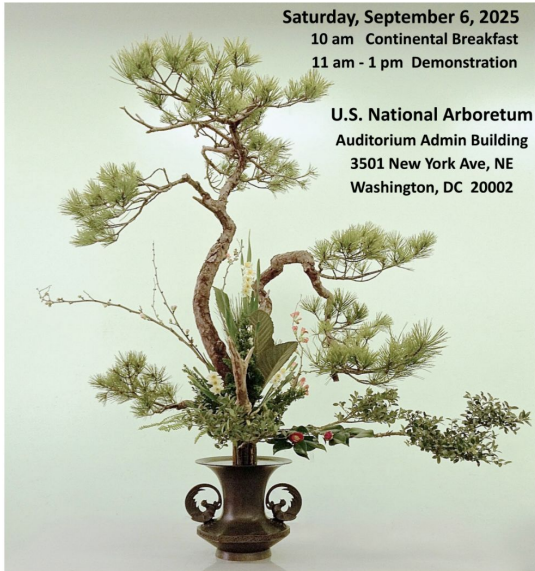

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SIGNING INTO THE UPDATED NCAGC WEBSITE

1. If you have not logged in yet, the login box will appear as shown in the green top bar.
2. Click the Login box and **type your email address**. *Very important! Just type in your email address. Ignore all prompts to sign in using Google or Facebook.*
3. **Use the email your garden club knows you by and submit a password**. This process will not be instantaneous. (It may take several hours, or up to a day.) *This process was almost instantaneous for me. You will receive a code in your email. You must enter the confirmation code into a box at the new website. I received the confirmation code within 20 seconds of typing in a password. See point 5 below for new members...*
4. At this point, you can still visit all of the website, except the "Members Resources" section.
5. **If you are a relatively new NCAGC member you will have to sign in and provide a password, and your account will be approved by a human!** It may take several days. Just scroll down the "Welcome!" page (or click on Explore More) and find the Member Resources tile, and follow the same procedure as above.
6. OK! Now you are [probably almost] in!! But we can still look at ALL of the web site (except for Member Resources). You can stop at any time, but if you have left it open for a while, you may need to refresh your page. Just click the backward circling arrow at the very top of your screen.
