

The **KEYSVILLE GARDEN CLUB**, part of the South Central District, has been busy this spring and summer.

In March we created table decorations for the Charlotte County Meals on Wheels gala; we also decorated and filled treat jars for all Meals on Wheels recipients to distribute near Easter.

NATURAL BRIDGE GARDEN CLUB

Chances are you've never seen a kokedama or might not know what it is if you did.

Recently, members of the Natural Bridge Garden Club were introduced to this Japanese art form by Sherry Godfrey, a potter/gardener from North Carolina.

Kokedama, or "moss ball", is an ancient Japanese art form that is derived from the practice of bonsai.

The beauty of exposed bonsai roots, which would accumulate moss over time, was the inspiration behind kokedama. It was often referred to as "the poor man's bonsai" because it was a simpler, more affordable way for people to enjoy the tranquility of a Japanese garden in their homes.

In kokedama, the root ball of a plant is coated in mud and covered in a sheet of moss, which symbolizes longevity and is in harmony with its surroundings. The plant doesn't require a lot of attention and can last as long as three years.







THE BUCKINHAM-DILLWYN GARDEN CLUB:



Neal is a Landscape Architect and Certified Arborist with over 25 years of experience in the fields of Horticulture, Arboriculture, Irrigation, Landscape Construction and Public Gardening. Neal studied horticulture at N. C. State University and was formerly the Manager of Horticulture

at the Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden. As an Arborist, he assesses trees during the site analysis to best determine protection strategies or removal. Laurie Fox is a faculty member in the Horticulture department at Virginia Tech and is based at the Hampton Roads Agricultural Research & Extension Center in Virginia Beach, VA where she has extension and research responsibilities. She received her BS & MS degrees in Horticulture from North Carolina State University, with an emphasis on landscape design, ornamental plant production, and weed science, and her Ph.D. from Wageningen University, The Netherlands. Laurie is an author and the publisher of Best Plants for Hampton Roads - A Landscape and Garden Companion.

Peggy Singlemann

Peggy Singlemann is nationally known as one of the foremost gardening experts. Her experience in the field is exceeded only by her infectious enthusiasm in sharing knowledge of best practices. She is a familiar figure as the longtime host and co-producer of Virginia's only TV show, *Virginia Home Grown*, on Virginia Public Media/PBS. Peggy is also prominent in this field for her transformative role renewing and overseeing the garden and grounds of the historic estate Maymont in Richmond. She holds professional certifications as an arborist, horticulturist, and landscape designer and has greatly expanded knowledge in the gardening/landscape design fields through her national and regional speaking engagements, contributions to publications, and consulting work via her business, RVA Gardener LLC. In 2022, the Virginia General Assembly presented a commendation to Peggy for her outstanding guidance, restoration, and preservation of Maymont's gardens, grounds, and arboretum over 38 years of service.

David Seward

David Seward recently retired from Reynolds Community College as the Program Head for the Horticulture Program for 18 years. He spent a total of 25 years teaching for the Horticulture Program at Reynolds. He has worked a toral of 40 years working and teaching in the green industry, predominantly focused on Landscape management and Plant materials. While at Reynolds, he developed a Commercial Pesticide Applicator Training Program, a Career Studies Certificate for Sustainable Agriculture, and a Sustainable Landscapes course. He received his BS in Biology from Old Dominion University and his MS in Horticulture from Virginia Tech.
